From the Executive Director

We had our New Era Party on May 11 to show our gratitude to all of our devoted patrons and members who have helped us repay the over \$600,000 loan for the roof restoration of the Heritage Center. Even though this gave us some budgetary constraints, it's now completed. We can move forward with other restoration work and create more engaging exhibits. On the day of our New Era Party, over a hundred individuals attended events, ate hors d'oeuvres, and drank champagne at the Heritage Center. A packed house attended a town hall talk given by Cora Wickham-Hermann about the extensive history of Starr's Cave and its location. Don Weiss, board chair, concluded the evening with a touching statement thanking everyone present for their years of support towards the Historical Society. I addressed items that were given to our time capsule. We still have donations to come in, so our time capsule will be sealed at a later time.

We will be doing some cleaning at the Heritage Center starting around June 14 - 15 and potentially close for a few days prior to and during the Snake Alley Art Fair, held on June 16. We are happy to inform you that Garrett-Phelps will reopen from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. as part of the Snake Alley Art Fair. Throughout the day, there will be a nominal admission fee of \$5.00 for adults and \$2.00 for children. This will assist us in funding some urgently required home renovations and repairs. After your selfguided tour, there will be an optional survey about the accessibility and current interpretation of the house museum. We hope to see you there! A Gift in Your Will or Living Trust



Out of the Collection



We have a wide range of genres and subjects covered in our collection of Des Moines County photos. Men and families driving their cars is one of the most popular photo genres. When automobiles were first introduced to the market, they were costly and risky purchases. In addition to the scarcity of parts and the lack of expertise among blacksmiths to produce certain mechanisms, pharmacies only carried a meager supply of gasoline, which was mostly meant for cleaning purposes. At one point, Burlington made an attempt to enter the auto industry by contracting a local wagon firm to build one of these cars.

The John Burg & Sons Wagon Company (also known as the John Burg Wagon Co.), located at 1001 Osborne Street, was founded in 1851 and moved to Missouri in 1910. It is well-known that, as early as 1897, a wagon maker by the name of Ed Burg considered the concept of a horseless carriage and provided funding for the development of an electric or gasoline-powered car prototype. His wagon makers and blacksmiths set to work creating a conventional, but well-liked, piano delivery wagon modified to support the added weight of a motor. Rather than scare pedestrian and horses, he decided to go with the notion of an electric automobile and bought parts from a company in Chicago. A short while later, motors, batteries, chains, and sprockets were delivered.

The horseless carriage had a false bottom and held 50 battery cells, weighing a total of 1,200 pounds. It could travel up to 36 miles in one direction and reach a top speed of 12 miles per hour. In April 1901, it made its maiden trip along Jefferson Street and covered eighteen miles before making the 18-mile trip back to the shop to recharge. Although this presented a marketing challenge, Burg motor wagons continued to advance until the mid-1910s, when they were replaced by more advanced Burg gasoline cars. The original motorcar's fate is unknown, but if it has survived, it would be among the most sought-after artifacts



at our museum.

Although there isn't a picture of this horseless carriage available, the collection does contain a well-known picture of the "Vaughn Bros." building with ten men standing outside. One of the earliest sales firms to sell boats and carriages without horses was Vaughn Bros. In addition, they provided rentals-which, as far as we know, was a first for the county.


