From the Executive Director

How fantastic the Viking riverboat season finale was! I am unable to express how grateful our board and I are to the staff and volunteers who so kindly gave their time to ensure that our Viking guests saw Des Moines County history in its fullest form. We are still figuring out how many people visited the Garrett-Phelps House and the Heritage Center. We anticipated fewer riverboats this year due to the American Cruise Line's absence, but we nevertheless made the most of each and every visitor to our historic locations.

Christmas at the Garrett-Phelps House will be a little different this year, in case you haven't heard. Traditionally, we have had a Christmas dinner in the house for the previous 20 years. Since the house requires particular attention, this year's Christmas dinner will be held at the Heritage Center in an effort to launch a new initiative to restore the house to its former splendor. The Heritage Trust's Tour of Homes, Snake Alley Art Fair, and Viking Mississippi River excursions all contribute to an increase in visitors at Garrett-Phelps. For the house to handle the influx of tourists, it must be updated and reexamined. This includes indexing, updating the signage, restaging, reimagining the Garrett-Phelps narrative, and our yearly thorough cleaning of all the home artifacts. All of this is a part of the Des Moines County Historical Society's strategy to raise awareness of Garrett-Phelps' significance in our community. The house also has to be improved in terms of both its structural soundness and appearance.

Owning a Victorian home is never a done project, as many people are aware. The house needs a new furnace, brick tuck pointing, new windows, a new roof, and many carpentry projects, such as the back porch. Our goal is to have sufficient funding by Winter 2026 to restore the house by the end of its 175th anniversary. Your assistance and support are needed. I'm going to give a ten-minute talk regarding our future during the Christmas dinner at the Heritage Center on December 7th. Dinner will be served at 6 pm, with a cocktail hour from 5:30 to 6:30 pm.

In the Grand Gallery, there will be ten tables with eight people at each. A table can be reserved for \$500, or each chair can be reserved for \$75. We currently have 80 available seats, so book yours now! Three live, silent film presentations with me on the Martin Bruhl piano will be a special program during the meal. Our first film, "Melodrama Rides the Rails," which is around 13 minutes long, chronicles some of the earliest railroad accidents and drama of the Gilded Era of cinema from around 1904-1911. The next is Buster Keaton's exuberant 20-minute comedy, "Convict 13," released in 1920. This movie has amazing stunt work by a slapstick master who, while attempting to break out of a false incarceration, falls in love with a jail warden's daughter. Finally, we will screen a silent cinema classic from 1913 called "Barney Oldfield's Race for a Life." In this comedy, the archetypal villain ties his girl to the tracks, but her true love arrives at the last second to save her!

Out of the Collection

Object ID: 2024.107 1859 Certificate of Naturalization

A recently accessioned document in the Des Moines County Historical Society's collection is this certificate of naturalization issued at the Court House in Burlington, dated October 11, 1859. Des Moines County Judge Oliver C. Wightman authenticated the record and the pink stamp in the bottom left corner is the Des Moines County seal.

German immigrant 'Martin Ohlschlager' is the subject of the document. After some research, the individual's name has been identified in this document to be misspelled, as there are no records of an Ohlschlager, but rather Oelschlager.


In early American law history, namely during the "Old Law" Period (March 26, 1790 - September 26, 1906), certificates of citizenship were commonly called certificates of naturalization. During this time, any "court of record," in this case, the county court, was allowed to grant United States citizenship. Due to the absence of statutory instruction or administrative oversight, early certificates were not uniformly made, leading these documents to look different depending on where they were issued and often did not include important biographical information. Many times, the only details contained in the document were the applicant's name, the names of witnesses, the country to which they were renouncing allegiance, and the court that was issuing citizenship.

From the certificate:

On this day came Martin Ohlschlager an alien, a native of Germany and applied to be admitted a citizen of the United States, and having made the proof and taken the oath required by law, it is ordered by the Court here that said Martin Ohlschlager be admitted a citizen of the United States.

State of Iowa, Des Moines County

I, O.C. Wightman Judge of the County Court within and for said County do hereby certify the foregoing to be a true, perfect and complete Transcript of the order



of Naturalization of M. Ohlschlager as the same now remains of Record in said Court.

In Testimony Whereof, I hereunto set my hand and affix the seal of said Court at my office in the City of Burlington, in said County this eleventh day of October A.D. 1859.
