## From the Executive Director

How the year has begun! I am unable to express my gratitude to the board, staff, volunteers, and patrons for their ongoing support to the Heritage Center, Garrett-Phelps House, and Crapo Park Log Cabin.

As you may know, American Cruise Lines was unable to visit Burlington this year due to a stop in operations. Our personnel and volunteers were unfazed by this, as we thrived on carrying out our goal for Viking Cruises.

The museum will have a busy year in 2025 as we start renovating the Garrett-Phelps House. We are searching for long-term financing that can sustain a team of employees, in addition to funding renovations to facilities and patching up aesthetic flaws. We greatly benefit from your contribution.

The library stacks renovation continues according to plan. We are currently painting scuffs all over the room and buffing the floor. The museum's neighbor, a carpenter, is building a ramp that will descend one aisle, cross another stack aisle, and then ramp back up. (Note: for the pathway, the stacks are undamaged and intact.) As a result, there will be less congestion in the exhibit during riverboat season, allowing people to browse the many antiquities the old library has gathered while walking in and around the ground floor of the stacks! Naturally, the space is glistening, and a smile is returned by our renowned "Hypatia" stained glass window. Soon after some cosmetic repairs are completed, electrical work will begin, reintroducing our nationally supported funding to

restore the inside lights to its 1901 appearance.

For those of you who are curious about early Iowa statehood, early politics, and early genealogy, through a series of letters, our newest exhibit in construction, "My Dear Vinnie," examines the lives of Governor James Wilson Grimes and his adopted daughter Lavinia "Vinnie" Noble Grimes Nichols Buck. Later, due to the kind donor, Joyce Harvey, we will publish a book with the transcriptions of the letters and providing more details on the correspondence between the two. Additionally, the exhibit will feature updated signs about the bas-reliefs, the connection between Governor Grimes and Rev. Salters, and a variety of family artifacts. Although the exhibit is still under development, it should be finished by the end of February 2025.

It's satisfying to take account of all the effort we put into restoring the Heritage Center's "old side." Although there is still some work to be done, the interior of the structure appears to be ten years old rather than one hundred. The phrase "The building feels like it wraps around you like a cozy blanket of history" was my favorite thing I have ever heard from a visitor. A confirmed date for the stacks' unveiling will be announced in the upcoming newsletter.

# A Gift in Your Will or Living Trust

A gift in your will or living trust is one of the most effective ways to provide for the future of DMCHS and allows you to retain your assets during your lifetime. In addition, your estate may benefit from a charitable estate tax deduction.

The gift may be easily included in your will when it is written, or it may be added through a simple codicil or amendment. You may wish to leave DMCHS a stated dollar amount; a percentage of your residual estate (what remains after debts, taxes and specific bequests have been made); or a specific asset, such as securities or other marketable property.

It can be as simple as adding the following language to your last will and testament: "I give and bequeath to the Des Moines County Historical Society, presently of 501 N 4th Street, Burlington, IA 52601, the sum of \$\_\_\_ to be used for its general support."

### Out of the Collection

### Clinton-Copeland Co. Holly Brand Chocolates Box ca. 1910-1930 80.13 (15)

This attractive Clinton-Copeland Co. box originally held 8 ounces of the company's Holly Brand Chocolates. The lid depicts a young lady with blonde hair and a yellow halo looking and smiling back at the viewer. Her loose-fitting blue gown with red accents and lace trim paired with pink high-heeled shoes make for an eye-catching design for a box of chocolates. This is in line with the reputation of the company, or as an article from *The Burlington Evening Gazette* (May 4, 1907) states; the "Clinton - Copeland Company take high rank among wholesale confectioners of the Middle West," and their "Holly Chocolates [...] are made of the very purest material in the cleanest candy kitchen in the country by expert workmen."

The box reads:

"Net Weight Eight Ounces Clinton - Copeland Co. Burlington IA" 8" x 4" x 1" in. box

Holly Brand Chocolates manufactured by the Clinton-Copeland Company developed from the Clinton-Copeland Candy Company, organized in 1898. In 1905, Clinton - Copeland Co. grew their business and built a four-story brick building for manufacturing and sale located at 100 - 102 - 104 South Fourth Street located conveniently directly south of the railroad tracks, making unloading raw materials and shipping final products an efficient process.

By 1907, the company held 125 employees at their manufacturing site and eight salesmen on the road to find a market for their goods in the states of Iowa, Illinois, Minnesota, and Missouri. The company operated until the late 1930s when the company dissolved. Today, there are remnants of the painted Holly Brand Chocolates logo on the exterior of the south wall of the building.

In an article from *The Burlington Hawk Eye* (August 4, 1915), Robert Stoddart wrote an essay detailing a tour of the Clinton - Copeland Company and began by saying that the "visit to Burlington's best candy factory was entirely a success."



He goes on to describe all four floors and the basement of the building that manufactured Holly Brand Chocolates. The basement held raw materials and a well that sourced the water for the entire company. The main floor was used for business and packing, while the upper floors were where butter-scotch, fondant, dipped chocolates, caramels, and gumdrops were made.

At the close of the tour, all participants received a box of Holly Brand Chocolates and a ruler.
