#### From the Executive Director

Iowa's weather is undoubtedly fickle. When it snows, it makes our tasks at the museums more difficult since, one day, my team and I have to shovel as much snow as we can to keep the museum open. Simply wait a few days, and things will improve, as they say.

In between "The Stacks" and "My Dear Vinnie," exhibits proceed as usual. The stacks area appears taller and lighter thanks to new ceiling tiles. Our carpenter, Ellie Jacobs, installed an ADA ramp around the exhibits for the best possible view of the antiquities, and for that I am incredibly grateful. Additionally, I'm grateful for Preservation Station's kind contribution of banister railings and reused flooring for the ramp! When the ramp is finished, I can't wait to check it out because this makes it seem as period as possible with the room.

Additionally, I have been using my table saw to cut enormous sheets of acrylic to use as window-like inserts in the stack bookcases. It was decided to show the space to the public on May 30 and May 31 after meeting with the grant holders. The grant holders will be able to view the exhibit during a semi-private event on May 30. The Heritage Center will be open from 4:00 to 6:00 pm, and admission is \$75.00. Members of the community will also receive special invitations, but if you receive a letter, the museum will waive the admission fee. Live music, substantial hors d'oeuvres, and the grand opening of the exhibitions and new gift store are all planned. I proposed a networking opportunity on May 31 from a number of groups and individuals that represent a specific facet of Des Moines County Heritage and History. We anticipate great music, on-site food and beverage, and public

exhibits! On that day, we also hope to open Garrett-Phelps to the public.

Although admission will be charged, the proceeds from the event will go toward staffing and restoring the Garrett-Phelps House. As you are aware, the roof and brick exterior of Garrett-Phelps require significant conservation work. Although it's encouraging to think that Garrett-Phelps might get a rear porch this year, there are several issues with the structure's conservation that need to be fixed. We hope you can make it to the activities on May 30 and May 31. We hope this becomes a yearly tradition if everything goes well this year. The weekend is referred to as "Snake Alley Days." Look out for a separate flier in the mail.

As many of you are aware, Mary Krohlow, a friend of the museum and a beloved historian, passed away a few weeks ago. She had a plethora of historical knowledge about Des Moines County and was an inspiration. The Museum Board of Directors, employees, volunteers, and I would like to express our sympathies to the Krohlow family. Mary Krohlow was one of the numerous founders of our Historical Society at the Heritage Center and a cornerstone of the history community. We will be putting a plaque in her honor on a stack in the Library Exhibit on behalf of the Historical Society because of her efforts to preserve Des Moines County Heritage.

## A Gift in Your Will or Living Trust

A gift in your will or living trust is one of the most effective ways to provide for the future of DMCHS and allows you to retain your assets during your lifetime. In addition, your estate may benefit from a charitable estate tax deduction.

The gift may be easily included in your will when it is written, or it may be added through a simple codicil or amendment. You may wish to leave DMCHS a stated dollar amount; a percentage of your residual estate (what remains after debts, taxes and specific bequests have been made); or a specific asset, such as securities or other marketable property.

It can be as simple as adding the following language to your last will and testament: "I give and bequeath to the Des Moines County Historical Society, presently of 501 N 4th Street, Burlington, IA 52601, the sum of \$\_\_\_ to be used for its general support."

#### Out of the Collection

Reeves, Winona Evans, editor. *The Blue Book of Iowa Women: A History of Contemporary Women*. Press of the Missouri Printing and Publishing Company, 1914.

This month's "Out of the Collection" item reflects the contributions of women in Iowa history. It honors Women's History Month 2025 and the theme "Moving Forward Together! Women Educating & Inspiring Generations," highlighting the transformative power of women who have shaped the world through education, mentorship, and leadership.


Published in 1914, *The Blue Book of Iowa Women: A History of Contemporary Women*, compiled and edited by Winona Evans Reeves, highlights many of the distinguished and remarkable Iowa women of the time.

From the preface:

"No state in the union has produced a better or a higher type of womanhood than Iowa. From pioneer days until the present they have had a very helpful interest in the advancement of education, of the arts, of literature, of religious and moral training, in the great work of philanthropy and of social service in all of its phases. Some of them have been women of unusual talent and have a national reputation, and some have a world-wide reputation."

This book includes women who made an impact in Des Moines County. Among them, Miss Lille West Brown Buck, or "Amy Leslie," was an actress, opera singer, drama critic, and author. Another influential woman, Miss Jennie Coulter, was known for opening a school for neglected children called 'The Children's Mission.' Mrs. Edith Forbes Perkins is named "one of the most interesting women in Iowa [...] a woman of striking personality and gracious manner" (Evans, p.121).

Two women artists are featured in the book as well. Miss Katherine H. Scott attended Burlington schools and later exhibited her work in oil portraits and miniatures in the St. Louis Expedition and other prominent galleries in



Chicago and western cities. From Mt. Pleasant, Iowa, Miss Harriet Ketcham, who was the original artist for the Iowa Soldiers' and Sailors' Monument in Des Moines, also has an individual biography in the book.
